does not have direct contact with but occasionally communicates with her through various social media accounts. She last had contact with her daughter about 3 weeks ago. She was in the hospital and showed up drunk at 11pm and caused a scene. Her suspicions were raised when she saw that attempted to message her the afternoon of 04-11-2017. She believes this type of attack would be an example of the intimidation would use to keep people out of her daughter's life. admits immediately upon seeing her attacker, before he even approached, she thought of "bad crowd."

She described the attacker as a "Mexican" man in his mid 20s with a stocky build. She distinctly recalls a tattoo on one hand, almost sure the right, but couldn't recall what it was. He was wearing a dark sweatshirt with the hood up that had a skeletal print on it. He was holding some sort of metallic object, it may have been a pocket knife, or box cutter, or possibly just keys. His car was an older white 4door with tinted windows.

With regards to the attack

reported she left at 5am to get to the center early to read. She attended a 5:45am prayer that ended almost exactly at 6am, then walked directly home down 13th St. As she approached Barnard Av she noticed the white car parked just west of the corner on the south side of the street. When she crossed the man exited the driver door and called her over to him as he began to approach her. She said "I don't know you" and continued walking. The man responded "But I know who you are" and grabbed her by the arm of her coat, and threw her to the ground. He immediately began to strike her to the head and body. She shouted "Stop! What do you want?" He responded "This IS what I want" as he continued to hit her. She understood this to mean he just wanted to beat her.

said the man did not demand anything or attempt to take anything from her. After an estimated minute the man got back into his car and drove away. She thinks he went north on 13th, then west on Layton.

As a result of the attack suffered multiple scratches and bruises to her head and face, sore back/ribs, scrapes to her arm, and spent a night in the hospital.

showed the clothes she was wearing at the time of the attack. Her hajib was stained with blood that she believes came from her nose. The black nylon down coat had a jagged tear to one arm, and what appeared to be a straight slice down the middle of the back.

CSO Jimmy MORALES-COLON came to the scene and took photos of street corner where the attack occurred.

She stated because the material of her jacket was thick the object did not penetrate through to her skin.

stated as she was on the ground she yelled for him to stop and she asked him what he wanted. She stated the man responded "This is what I want" as he continued to kick her.

stated after being attacked the man got back into his car and drove away. She stated to the best of her recollection, the man fled northbound on S. 13th St.

described the suspect as a Hispanic male, mid 20s, 5'06", stocky build with a solid tattoo of an unknown design on the top of his right hand. She stated he was wearing a black hoodie with the hood over his head and the draw string pulled tight so the hood closed to cover most of his face. Stated the only part of his body that was exposed were his hands and the cheeks and nose of his face. Upon asking her is she would be able to recognize the suspect if she saw him again she replied that she didn't think she could because she couldn't see most of his face. She described his car as being a "junky" older model white 4 door car, unknown make.

While I was at residence I informed her that I would be showing her a photo array. I provided her with a MPD Supplemental Report on Photo Array Identification Form PC-24 and I had her read the instructions on the form. After reading the form stated she understood photo array procedure and the instructions she read. She signed and dated the form and stated she was prepared to view the photo array. I then provided with eight manila folders, six of which each contained a color booking photo created from Photo Lineup ID #68120. Each photo in the array were booking photos of Hispanic males similar in age and description to the target suspect.

After viewing the photos contained in all the folders stated that she didn't recognize any of the subjects as the man who attacked her. She stated although she couldn't see the suspect's entire face she knows that he had, "chubby cheeks" and that he was a larger build than all the subjects in the photo array. I pointed out the photo of and asked if she recognized him as someone who knows her daughter. She stated he looked vaguely familiar and that she may have seen a photo of him on her daughter's Facebook page. I also showed her close up photos of the tattoo's on his hands and she stated the they were not the same tattoo that the suspect had on his hand.

stated she does not feel she was attacked because she is Muslim. It should be noted that contrary to what was reported on the news, according to the man who attacked her did not try to take her hajib. Although she wears a hajib to cover her head, the style she wears is a thin material that looks similar to scarves commonly worn by elderly females. This style is worn over her head but it does not cover any part of her face.

stated although she didn't recognize the man, she feels he intentionally targeted her and that this possibly had something to do with her estranged daughter,

She stated she doesn't approve of her daughter's lifestyle and she is appalled by the fact that her daughter recently left her husband and she is now in a lesbian relationship with another woman. She stated the woman her daughter is dating is very controlling and she knows that she

) doesn't approve of her daughter's relationship.

acknowledged that she doesn't have any evidence that this attack was in any way related to her daughter or her friends however, she feels that is why she was targeted.
